- 12 An Australian bush-tucker plant producing small, edible fruits traditionally eaten by Indigenous people.
- 13 An Australian tree that produces dark purple fruit, rich in flavour and traditionally used as food.
- 15 A famous Australian wildflower with striking red petals and a dark centre, South Australia's floral emblem.
- 17 Small, flowering Australian shrubs with delicate bell-shaped flowers.
- 18 A starchy tuber plant, traditionally an important food source for Indigenous Australians.
- 19 A carnivorous plant with special tube-shaped leaves that trap insects.
- 20 A plant that provides shelter for ants, which in turn protect the plant.
- 21 A fruit-bearing tree whose flowers grow hidden inside the fruit.
- 24 A beautiful flowering plant often recognised by its large, colourful, trumpet-shaped blooms.


- 2 A small fern with distinctive leaves, known as the adder's tongue fern.

- 8 A bright red, large flower that is the floral emblem of New South Wales.
- 9 A tiny, rare plant that grows underground, often without leaves and obtains nutrients from fungi.
- 11 A tough, palm-like plant with large seeds traditionally used as food by Indigenous Australians.
- 14 An Australian tree covered in stinging hairs that cause extreme pain when touched.
- 16 A native Australian grass with reddish stems, often eaten by kangaroos.
- 22 A plant whose bark produces medicine traditionally used to treat malaria.
- 23 Grass-like plants known as rushes, often found in wetlands or damp areas.
