ANSWER KEY

1954	Queen Elizabeth II visits the Shrine during her first Australian tour.	
1918	World War I ends with the Armistice on 11 November.	
2003	New underground visitor centre and education facility opened beneath the Shrine.	
1934	Shrine of Remembrance officially opened on 11 November (Remembrance Day).	
1927	Construction of the Shrine begins, marked by laying the foundation stone.	
2021	Centenary commemorations begin planning for the 100-year anniversary of the Shrine project.	
1985	The Shrine is rededicated to commemorate all Australians who served in war and peacekeeping missions, not only WWI soldiers.	
1922	Architects Phillip Hudson and James Wardrop win the competition to design the Shrine.	
1945	Large crowds gather at the Shrine to celebrate the end of World War II.	
1968	The eternal flame is lit at the Shrine as a lasting symbol of remembrance.
